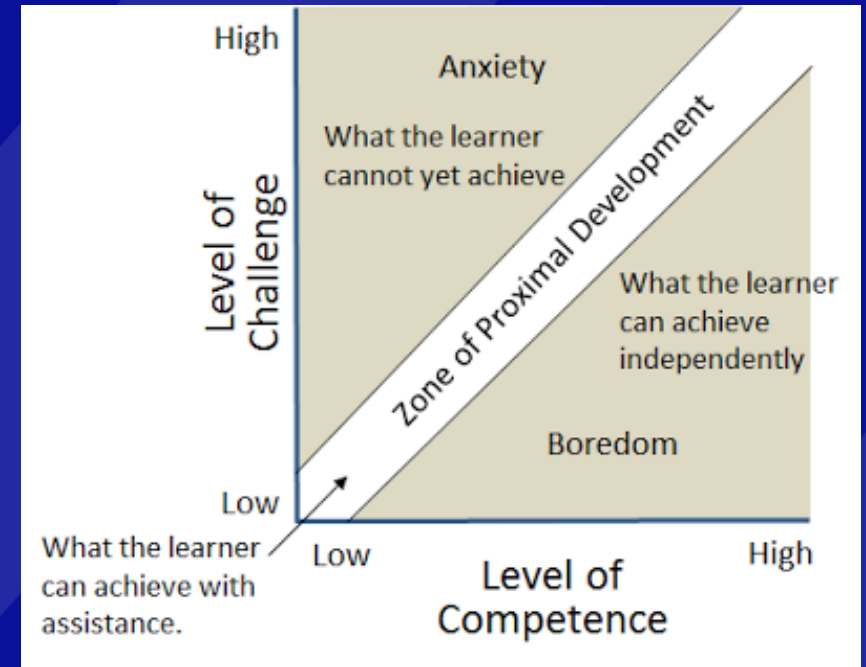
Clinical Environments
