Chancellor's Update

We're pleased to be able to open the VA building during the week of Veteran's Day to demonstrate our commitment to the veterans for their service.

Dr. Job Dekker and Dr. Kate Fitzgerald were just inducted into the National Academy of Medicine.

The UMass Chan Cares giving campaign kicked off on November 1st and will run through Thanksgiving. There are approximately 1,000 charitable entities to choose from.

PRESENTATIONS

Morningside Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences Bylaws

Dr. Lane presented the revised GSBS bylaws. Motion to endorse; motion approved.

VA Clinic & Opportunities for Collaboration

Dr. Mattocks presented on the new VA Worcester Community Based Outpatient Clinic which is a 48,000 sq. ft. health care facility. As a part of the VA Central Western Massachusetts Health Care system, the outpatient clinics will offer primary, specialty, and mental health care. Services are provided to a Veteran population in central and western Massachusetts of more than 120,000 men and women. The main hospital is in Northampton, MA and there are other community clinics in Worcester, Springfield, Fitchburg, Greenfield, and Pittsfield.

The UMass VA location will provide care to roughly 7,000 Veterans. Eventually, the services offered at the Plantation Street location (in the ACC) will be moved to the new building. The services will include audiology, optometry, podiatry, physical therapy, blind rehab, and research. Other specialty services will also be offered in the new building to include dermatology, rheumatology, cardiology, and neurology.

Veterans will have the opportunity to receive specialty care from providers at the new VA clinic and at UMMHC.

In the new VA facility, Graduate Medical Education (training) is being offered to UMMS residents and fellows in several areas of primary and specialty care.

The facility should be up and running by December 15, 2021.
