2	Melissa Fischer	Discussion of AY20-21 and the impact of COVID-19
		Fall 2020
		 Acknowledgement that the upcoming Fall semester will look different from last year, embracing creative solutions and alternatives to in-person classes, especially large group lectures – some things will remain virtual and remote, regardless of state and federal guidelines for COVD-19 due to the success of these sessions running virtually, and the medical school's ultimate goal to integrate more remote learning into the curriculum moving forward.

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		Confirmation that some courses will still be held on campus, following the CDC's recommended safety protocols defined at the time
		 Goal is to continue to add to student learning, with as many up-front changes and adjustments as possible in anticipation of future circumstances
		Slow and gradual return for students to clinical settings
		 Clerkship-specific questions regarding sites and capacity will be taken offline for further discussion and strategizing

		General Lessons Learned
		o Faculty are encouraged to add a 'Questions?' slide every fifth slide
		Students are encouraged to use the 'raise your hand' feature and enter questions into the Chat box Table Tab
		 Faculty are encouraged to monitor the Chat simultaneously, either with the support of another person, or on their own INF – large groups (via Zoom) were successful during their course
		• FM clerkship – small group sessions via Zoom were successful and utilized student facilitation, with the exception of the MI session (17 students) which did not run smoothly.
		Question – how do we bridge the gap for students with issues logging in or connecting?
