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Location	University Campus for inpatients, Memorial and Hahnemann Campus sites for outpatients
Day One Instructions	Generally, on a Monday, you will report to University Campus ID office, Room S7-715, at 8:45 AM to Kathy Scalley who will page the ID fellow on service. For inpatients you will work mostly with the fellow and attending on service the week of the FCE. You will also have the opportunity to go to TB clinic and see some other ID out patients. The student should send us an email 2 weeks prior to the FCE to receive the handout and their schedule

FCE DESCRIPTION

This rotation will include at least 2 of the following half-day sessions: an outpatient public health tuberculosis clinic, a general ID clinic and a travel clinic. The inpatient portion will include rounding with Infectious Diseases Attending, Fellows, residents and 4th year medical students on a general inpatient ID consult service at University campus. The student will do all, or part (depending on student's level of experience), of one to three patient new evaluations per week and see follow-up patients with the team.

FCE LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- describe the medical and social evaluation, and treatment, of a patient with latent tuberculosis. describe barriers to care in recent immigrants
- perform, present and document a clinical history, physical exam, and microbiological data of patients requiring inpatient or outpatient infectious diseases consultation (This will be adjusted for student experience in other clinical rotations done prior to date of rotation.)
- explain the need for communication and joint decision making between the consulting and referring physicians
- describe the use of the microbiology lab in evaluating a patient with an infection
