FCE DESCRIPTION

This FCE will allow the student to build a knowledge base regarding the care of immunocompromised patients with infectious diseases, by participation with the multidisciplinary Transplant Program. This will include rounding with the ID faculty and fellow on the inpatient and ambulatory services as well as rounds with other specialties including surgery and ancillary staff. The student will attend meetings that review criteria for listing for Solid Organ transplant. The student will participate in all Infectious Disease Division and Transplant Program clinical multi-disciplinary rounds and educational conferences. The student will do all, or part (depending on student's level of experience), of one to three patient new evaluations per week and see follow-up patients with the team. They may participate in out patient Multi- D clinic, depending on the amount of time the student will spend on the FCE.

FCE LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- describe the medical and social evaluation of patients being listed for solid organ transplantation
- perform a clinical history and physical exam on patients who have an infectious diseases issue and who are immunocompromised because of their underlying hematological diseases or organ transplant. be able to present findings to the fellow and attending
- explain the need for communication and joint decision making between the consulting and referring physicians
- describe the use of the microbiology lab in evaluating an immunocompromised patient with an infection
