FCE DESCRIPTION

Neurocritical Care is one of the youngest and most rapidly growing sub-specialties of neurology, and knowledge in Neurocritical care is required by many other specialties including neurosurgery, emergency medicine, trauma and medicine. Under supervision by one of the on-service attendings, as well as Dr. Muehlschlegel, students will gain insight in the required cognitive and procedural skills to evaluate, and manage critically ill adult patients with catastrophic neurological/neurosurgical diseases. In addition, students will learn how to work in a multi-disciplinary and multi-professional team, and receive a practical introduction to communication with families of critically ill patients and outcome prognostication.
