## FCE DESCRIPTION

This FCE provides an opportunity for students to reflect in writing on their Core Clinical Experiences and the transformation process taking place in going from a lay person to a student-physician. It is recognized that the immersion in the work of clinical medicine during the third year of medical school is a significant driver of this developmental process. Students can write essays, creative nonfiction, poetry and short fiction, to sharpen their powers of observation, description and analysis. The writing process is designed to enhance participants' ability to understand – from their own perspective and that of others – the experience of becoming a doctor. Writing about encounters with patients, faculty, and other health care providers, and sharing the writing in a supportive group setting, facilitates mindfulness and deepens understanding of how these experiences influence one's personal and professional development.
