FCE DESCRIPTION

In this Flexible Clinical Elective (FCE), the student will: (1) investigate opportunities to write and publish in the area of global health; (2) act as a peer educator by contributing to an effort to assist other medical students in publishing on topics related to global health, and (3) work toward the goal of submitting a scholarly work related to a global health topic.

Scholarly work can include clinical case reports, research, essays, and editorials. In this FCE, global health is defined broadly, with a focus on underserved and vulnerable populations both in the U.S. and around the globe.

FCE LEARNING OBJECTIVES

The FCE objectives are to: (1) investigate opportunities to write and publish in the area of global health, (2) contribute to the resource that is being developed by Dr. Michael Chin and UMMS medical students, and that acts as a resource for medical students and residents in identifying opportunities for publishing scholarly work related to global health topics, and (3) work toward submitting a scholarly work related to a global health topic.

By the end of this Flexible Clinical Experience (FCE) the student will:

- be able to act as a mentor and educator of other medical students and medical professionals who are interested in writing and publishing scholarly work related to global health
- gain experience in writing and publishing
