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#### FCE DESCRIPTION

Students will be assigned to the Acute Pain Service team comprised of an attending anesthesiologist and anesthesia resident and a nurse practitioner. Daily activities will include assessing patients with post op pain, discussing anatomic considerations for peripheral and neuraxial blocks, understanding the pharmacology of local anesthetics, observing and performing procedures, getting initiated in managing patients with indwelling pain catheters, evaluating, presenting and managing patients with opioid tolerance, using multimodal approach in treating pain syndromes.

#### FCE LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Understand the various modalities used in managing patient with acute post-operative pain as well as chronic pain
- Learn about pharmacology and clinical use of opioids, COX inhibitors, and other pain adjuvants
- Understand the implications of peripheral nervous system anatomy in performing pain procedures
- Observe and possibly perform peripheral nerve blocks and neuraxial blocks
