FCE DESCRIPTION

Students will be assigned to the Acute Pain Service team comprised of an attending anesthesiologist and anesthesia resident and a nurse practitioner. Daily activities will include assessing patients with post op pain, discussing anatomic considerations for peripheral and neuraxial blocks, understanding the pharmacology of local anesthetics, observing and performing procedures, getting initiated in managing patients with indwelling pain catheters, evaluating, presenting and managing patients with opiod tolerance, using multimodal approach in treating pain syndromes.
