FCE DESCRIPTION

The primary purpose of Path Week! is to provide a broad range of experiences to help future physicians understand how pathology laboratories play critical roles in the care of essentially all patients. This brief exposure is well-suited for students in the clinical years who are interested in specialties besides pathology. The pathologist either directly or indirectly interacts with every physician who orders tests on blood and other fluids; biopsies or resects masses; performs Pap smears; requests urine toxicology or specimen culture; or requests blood products.

The field of pathology has two main arms: anatomic and clinical pathology. Anatomic pathology is the study of tissue specimens through gross and histologic evaluation and other specialized techniques. It includes general surgical and biopsy pathology, subspecialty surgical pathology, cytopathology, and autopsy and forensic pathology. Clinical pathology is the diagnostic study of fluids and tissues. It consists of hematology, chemistry, and microbiology as well as other disciplines.
